




#### Message from...PASTOR JEFF

#### The True Meaning of Christmas

Every year there are countless movies and television specials that end with someone learning the "true" meaning of the season. In those made for the season moments we are taught that the "true" reason for the season is something to do with caring for others, sharing, falling in love, spending time with family and friends, giving from our excess, maybe giving all that we have to those around us, and there may be others but that is the list that comes to mind as I type.

Kids know the real meaning of Christmas is found in cartoons and that they feel loved when the get the new toys that will be discarded by the end of Christmas Break. Teachers believe that it is about getting their sanity back to prepare for the run to spring break. Shoppers know it is about good deals, while the store owners know it is about yearly profits. Sunday school and many churches teach it is about wishing Jesus a happy birthday (He wasn't born on Dec. 25<sup>th</sup>). I actually like the sappy Hallmark Channel movies that have nothing to do with a biblical remembrance, but about framing "love" in the "magic and possibilities" of the season.

But all of these things at worst are blasphemous or at least fall short of the true meaning for the season. For sure we look to the manger where a baby was born to a virgin, but that manger scene only makes the Good Friday remembrance possible. It does not pay for my sins, offer me new life, enter into my heart with a Pentecostal revival, and it does not heal me of my physical and spiritual problems. It does say that God still cares for His creation and wants to save it. It does show that God is active and remembers His promises.



You see, it is the beginning of the journey to the cross, a beautiful moment that points to an ugly but monumental event in human history when all of our dirty laundry is put on display.

This is not the victory, only the beginning of the comeback of the fallen. Yet so many of us have that Christmas morning kind of faith, which demands nothing of us and costs noting for our redemption. Like a gift bought with a credit card that we enjoy on Christmas morning without any thought of the bill coming. Praise God because He saw the bill coming for you and I, He knew that we could never pay the bill and found a way to do it for us!!!!

What does your heart say "the true meaning of Christmas" is? Better question, what does your life say it is?

#### Online registration will begin January 3 at 7:00 pm CST

- ⇒ The registration fee is \$450. A non-refundable deposit of \$225 must be paid at the time of registration. The balance is due by April 30.
- ⇒ The conference will begin with registration at noon on Saturday and end at noon on Thursday. Meals, lodging, and programming are included in the registration fee.
- ⇒ All youth who have completed ninth grade through one year of college (at the time of NYC) are eligible to attend. All youth must be accompanied by an adult advisor.
- ⇒ Please send at least one advisor for every five youth. If you are sending female youth, please send a female advisor and if you are sending male youth, please send a male advisor. All adult advisors must be a minimum of 22 years of age. Children of participants, advisors and staff that are not eligible to attend NYC are not permitted.

# Wanna Be Worship

The Children's Church, 'Wanna Be Worship' is held weekly during worship time and is for Kindergarteners through Fifth Graders. The volunteers for the month of December are Jeanna Johnson & Joyce Simpson and the month's theme is... ... The Gift of Advent

The Gift Of Advent is a four-lesson group curriculum designed to give children a biblical understanding of



Christmas...from the garden - to the manger - to the cross. Each lesson focuses on a new gift that comes as a result of God's ultimate Gift - Jesus!

Lesson 1: The Gift of Hope: Our need for a Savior began all the way back in Genesis when sin entered the world. In this lesson children will read God's promises in Genesis 3:14-15 and Isaiah 9:6-7. They will learn how God had a rescue plan in place from the very beginning and why our hope should be in Christ alone!

Lesson 2: The Gift of Wisdom: Is just knowing about Jesus enough? The religious leaders knew the details of Jesus' birth, yet they did not go to worship Him. In this lesson children will read the story of the Magi in Matthew 2:1-12. They will learn the importance of putting their faith into action and what true wisdom requires.

Lesson 3: The Gift of Love: When God sent His Son to die on the cross, it was the ultimate example of love. Children will read from Ephesians 5 and discuss how we are to be imitators of God by walking in love as we follow His great example.

Lesson 4: The Gift of Joy: Like the angels proclaimed in Luke 2, Jesus' arrival is good news and should bring about great joy! Children will learn that the true meaning of Christmas is not something we should keep to ourselves. A Savior has been born! He is Christ the Lord!

Dear Jesus,


I've thought about being a good boy this year and can I have a new bicycle?

He aimlessly wandered about, depressed because of the way he treated his parents and really considering his actions. He finally found himself in front of a Catholic Church.



#### December 1 - First Sunday in Advent

In Advent we prepare. This isn't the kind of preparation we see in advertisements, but a preparing of heart and soul. Ask that God might shine a light onto our hearts that we may see plainly the times we lose hope in God's own redemption story.

#### **December 8 - Second Sunday in Advent**

This week is part of the denominational offering emphasis in Advent. As you give, both in presents and offerings, consider how your gifts reflect the peace of Christ. How are you speaking that peace to those around you? Pray that your gifts may be part of growing God's peace at home and around the world.

#### December 15 - Third Sunday of Advent

It's quite trite today to say that Love is a verb. Yet, Love is a way of life made known in the life, teaching, death, and resurrection of Jesus. In Advent we measure our own lives alongside the example of Christ. Where have you seen living examples of God's love? Pray for the courage to make your own life look more like Christ.

#### December 22 - Fourth Sunday in Advent

Those around us seem to think that Joy is about happiness or satisfaction. As we near the celebration of Christ's birth we are reminded that joy is a matter of abiding trust in the continued work of God- in times of strife and times of happiness. Pray for a renewed sense of trust and joy, both in your life and in your congregation.

#### December 29 - First Sunday after Christmas

For the church, Christmas has just begun. While those around us shift attention to the new year or the next holiday, we continue to celebrate Christ's birth. In prayer, ask what it may look like to expand the reality of Christmas beyond one day in December. How does your day to day life witness to the redeeming work of the Incarnation?


